<u>Neural responsivity to social rewards in autistic female youth</u> A study about the brain's reward system in autism, which found that autistic girls may find social interaction more rewarding than autistic boys do.

<u>Trajectories of Autism Symptom Severity Change During Early Childhood</u> This study found that the severity of core autism traits changes substantially in nearly half of autistic children from ages 3 to 6.

<u>Study links gene to inherited form of autism</u> This news article discusses a study which found that inherited mutations in a gene called ACTL6B lead to autism, epilepsy and intellectual disability. Read the full study here.

Autism linked to sleep problems and brain changes in infancy This article describes a study which suggests that children with autism are more likely than typical children to have had problems falling asleep as infants, according to a new study. These infants also have more growth in the hippocampus, the brain's memory hub, from age 6 to 24 months. The study is the first to link sleep problems to altered brain development in infants later diagnosed with autism.

<u>Altered learning may drive social inattention in autistic children</u> This article summaries a study which found that children with autism have trouble learning that faces convey information, but they excel at learning that some objects do. Full Text article here.
