Cognitive behavioral therapy may be only mildly effective for anxious, autistic children

Many autistic children rate the therapy as less effective at treating their anxiety than their parents and clinicians do.

National Autistic Society School Report 2021

This most recent report highlighted that over a quarter (26%) of parents waited over three years to receive support for their child. Three quarters (74%) said their child's school place did not fully meet their needs – this has almost doubled since 2017. Only one in four parents are satisfied with the special educational needs support their child is receiving. Less than half of autistic children are happy in school.
