Systematic Review

<u>Worldwide prevalence of suicidal ideation and suicide plan among people with schizophrenia: a meta-analysis and systematic review of epidemiological surveys</u>

This is a meta-analysis and systematic review of the prevalence of suicidal ideation (SI) and suicide plan (SP) among people with schizophrenia. The lifetime and point prevalence of SI were 34.5% and 29.9%, respectively. The lifetime prevalence of SP was 44.3% and the point prevalence of SP ranged between 6.4 and 13%.

Explores a recent qualitative study conducted in Scotland, which finds that the contexts in which men talk about suicide are an important part of male suicide prevention.

Nursing home staff mental health during the Covid-19 pandemic in the Republic of Ireland

The objective of this article was to quantify the mental health of nursing home staff during the Covid-19 pandemic in the Republic of Ireland. Moderate-severe post-traumatic stress disorder symptoms were found in 45.1% of all staff. A World Health Organisation-5 (WHO-5) wellbeing index score ≤32, indicating low mood, was reported by 38.7% of staff; significantly more nurses reported low mood. Suicidal ideation and suicide planning were reported, respectively, by 13.8% and 9.2% of participants with no between-group differences.

<u>Correlating heatwaves and relative humidity with suicide (fatal intentional self-harm)</u>

This article investigates the correlation between heatwaves and/or relative humidity and suicide (fatal intentional self-harm) on a global scale.
